Curriculum

Thank you to all of the parents who contributed to the children's learning last half term - either by talking them to them about their learning, taking them to places that would support their learning or helping them with their homework tasks. See the picture gallery for some amazing homework creations!

This term, the themes that we are covering are:

Willow Class - will continue their learning about seasonal changes and celebrations with a focus on Fairytales.

Sycamore Class - Could Robots take over the world? This theme will look at the changes in technology over the last 100 years.

Maple Class - What did the Romans do for us? Looking at the Roman invasion and occupation of Britain and how this has influenced life today.

Hazel Class - Blitz Street. Continuing the theme of World War 2 looking particularly at the Blitz, women's roles and evacuees.

LYFTA

We think it is really important that our children learn about how other people live - both in the UK and further afield. In Monday assemblies we have been using the LYFTA platform to do just this. LYFTA is a storyworld that tells the stories of people around the world, so far we have learnt about:

- Rob an artist who lives in Cornwall.
- Enanaye who lives in a small village in Ethopia.
- Michal a ballet dancer from Helsinki (Finland).
- Erkan who looks after street dogs in Ankara (Turkey).
